

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200240

Quarter corner common to Sections 29 and 30, Township 32 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found the original basalt stone 14x12x6-inch lying on top of the ground with a visible "4" facing west.

Replaced said stone and deposited alongside a 2½x32-inch galvanized iron pipe, 26 inches in the ground, with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

T32S R1W
¼S
30 | 29
C.S.
1986

Original bearing tree marked by R. S. Moore in 1883 found:

- A Sawed Pine stump 50-inch diameter, with reverse impression of scribe mks "¼S" bears Record: N38°E, 33.66 feet to estimated face.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and measure to center of tree at lower blaze:

- White Fir 11-inch diameter bears N28½°W, 36.82 feet.
- Cedar 8-inch diameter bears S64°E, 13.75 feet.

Corner lies 25 feet North of road, course N30°W and S30°E.

Quarter corner common to Sections 29 and 30, Township 32 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found at the corner position, exposed 5 ins., the 2 ins. diam. galv. iron pipe with a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap set on 1st Re-establishment in 1987, marked:

T32S R1W
¼S
30 • 29
1987

Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Rufus Moore of the GLO in 1883,

- A sawed rotted pine stump, brs. record; N 38° E, 33.7 ft. to estimated face.

Bearing trees recorded on said 1st Re-establishment found with healed double blazes and measured to center at lower blaze:

- W. fir, now 15 ins. diam. brs. record; N 28½° W, 36.8 ft.
- Cedar, now 11 ins. diam. brs. record; S 64° E, 13.8 ft.

Mark new bearing trees "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- D. fir 9 ins. diam. brs. N 22½° E, 7.0 ft.
- Madrone 6 ins. diam. brs. S 19¾° W. 44.9 ft.

Corner lies approx. 15 ft. northeasterly from logging road at top of cut bank.
