

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640200

Quarter corner common to Sections 25 & 36, Township 32 South, Range 1 West.

Found the corner stone monument dislodged from its original position.

Set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe with bronze cap stamped:

T32S,R1W
25
¼S — cor.
36
c.s. 1962

24" in the ground for corner.

From which:

- The original witness tree (now a 28" Fir) bears North 10° West, 17.2 feet;
- The original witness tree (now a 6" Fir plainly scribed) bears South 48° East, 4.5 feet.

From said pipe corner, I establish the following new witness trees:

- A 19" Douglas Fir, scribed "CS-BT" bears North 51½° West, 25.8 feet to the face of the upper blaze;
- An 8" Maple, scribed "CS-BT" bears South 43½° West, 38.0 feet to the face of the upper blaze.

Placed the original corner stone alongside the pipe corner.

**SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT
GCDB 640200**

Quarter corner common to Sections 25 and 36 of Township 32 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found at corner position exposed 10 ins. in a mound of stones, the 1 ins. diam. galv. iron pipe with a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap set on 1st Re-establishment in 1962 and marked:

T32S R1W

36
C.S. 1962

Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Rufus Moore of the GLO in 1883 found, a d. fir now 37 ins. diam., charred with healed blaze brs. record; N 10° W, 17.2 ft. to center at base.

Bearing tree recorded on said 1st Re-establishment found, a d. fir snag brs. record; N 51½° W, 25.8 ft. to center at lower blaze.

Set ⅝ x 24 ins. rebars with 1½ ins. diam. bronze cap marked:



And measured to center of cap

- Brs. S 53½° W, 14.15 ft. exposed 4 in.
- Brs. N 72½° E, 25.45 ft. exposed 12 ins. at base of 40 ins. diam. d. for.

Corner lies approx. 120 ft. southeasterly of gravel road on burned brushy hillside.
