

FIRST RENEWAL

GCDB 100340

Quarter corner on the range line between Section 24, Township 32 South, Range 3 East and Section 19, Township 32 South, Range 4 East.

Found a 12"x10"x8" basalt stone scribed "¼", which stone was not at the correct corner location. Set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe 34" in the ground with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

"T32S R3E / 4E CS ¼ Cor. 1961 24 -19"

for corner, with the original stone alongside.

From said pipe corner:

- The original witness tree (now an 18" White Fir) plainly scribed "¼" bears South 40° East, 26.4 feet.

I marked new trees as follows:

- The center of a 10" Chinquapin scribed "CS-BT" bears South 21° East, 34.7 feet;
- The Center of a 10" Chinquapin, scribed "CS-BT" bears North 59¾° West, 14.3 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 100340

Quarter corner common to Section 19, Township 32 South, Range 4 East and Section 24, Township 32 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

Found projecting 5 inches, the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with 2½-inch brass cap marked:

T32S R3&4E
24 | 19
1961
CS ¼ Cor.

An original bearing tree, recorded by R. Moore in 1884,

- Now a fir stob, 26-inch diameter, containing reverse impression of scribe mark in upper face overgrowth bears Record: S40°E, 26.4 feet to (reverse) face.

Bearing trees marked in 1961 found:

- Chinquapin, 13-inch diameter, scribed "CS" "BT" in unhealed blazes bears S21°E, 35.1 feet to center of tree at lower blaze. Record: 34.7 feet.
- Chinquapin, 14-inch diameter (leaning North) scribed "CS" "BT" in unhealed blazes bears N59¾°W, 14.4 feet to center of tree at lower blaze. Record 14.3 feet.

Marked a new tree "CS" "BT":

- White Fir, 18-inch diameter bears N27°W, 34.80 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- A found 5/8-inch diameter rebar, projecting 2 inches bears S½°W, 10.90 feet.

Corner lies on blazed North-South line, a 30% Northeast slope and about 150 feet North of the top of slope.
