

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700540

Quarter corner on the East line of Section 12, Township 32 South, Range 4 East, W.M.

Found the single remaining original bearing tree, recorded by R. Moore, in 1884, now a White Fir, 42-inch diameter, scribed "BT" in opened lower face.

From the preceding evidence, set a 1x36-inch Galvanized iron pipe, 35 inches in the ground, with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

T32S R4E
¼S 12 | R5E
C.S.
1988

From which:

- The above-described original bearing tree bears Record: S68°E, 8.58 feet to scribed face. The original Southwest bearing tree is now gone.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Fir, 14-inch diameter bears S3°E, 22.7 feet.
- Incense Cedar, 22-inch diameter bears N69°W, 70.5 feet.

Corner lies about 80 feet South of Red Blanket Road.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 70040

Quarter corner common to Section 12 only, Township 32 South, Range 4 East and 5 East, W.M.

Found at the corner position, exposed 1 inch, the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap set on First Re-establishment in 1988, marked:

T32S R4E
¼s 12 • R5E
C.S.
1988

Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by R. Moore of the GLO in 1884,

- A fir snag with cut-out lower blaze revealing scribe marks "BT" bears Record: S 68° E, 8.6 feet to face of lower blaze.

Bearing trees recorded on said First Re-establishment found with healed double blazes and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Fir, now 16-inch diameter bears Record: S 3° E, 22.7 feet.
- Cedar, now 25-inch diameter bears Record: N 69° W, 70.5 feet.

Marked new bearing tree "CS" "BT" and take measurement to center of tree at lower blaze:

- White Fir, 21-inch diameter bears N 1¼° W, 20.1 feet.
- A 4 feet high aluminum post with an "Attention" sign bears northwesterly, 2.5 feet.

Corner lies approximately 60 feet south of Red Blanket Road.
