

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 100240

Quarter corner common to Section 25, Twp. 34 South, Range 2 West and Section 30, Twp. 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M. $V = 20\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

From the following evidence, at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 22 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Jackson County 1975

R2W		R1W
S 25		S30

Original BTs recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, found as follows:

- White Oak, 22-inch diameter, scribed "BT" in opened lower face, bears record N67°E, 81.84 feet to scribed face.
- The root hole of a down and decayed Yellow Pine snag, scribed "¼S" and "BT" in weathered faces, bears record N83°W, 67.98 feet.

I mound stones around corner, marked new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 7-inch diameter, bears S55½°E, 35.80 feet.
- White Oak, 9-inch diameter, bears S67°W, 42.80 feet.

Corner lies 100 feet Easterly of blazed North-South line.
