

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 100540

Quarter corner common to Sections 12, Township 34 South, Range 2 West, and Section 7, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M. $V = 21\frac{1}{4}^\circ$

From the following evidence at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 30 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- The Westerly branch of a double Black Oak, 10-inch diameter, containing reverse impression of scribed "BT", bears record $S60^\circ E$, 18.48 feet to scribed face.
- A Black Oak, 24-inch diameter, with scribe marks visible in rotted upper face, bears record, $N73^\circ W$, 6.60 feet to estimated face of lower blaze.

I marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Douglas Fir, 10-inch diameter, bears $S54\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 21.67 feet.
- A Black Oak, 10-inch diameter, bears $S86^\circ W$, 44.75 feet.

Corner lies about 75 feet West of stream, 3 feet West of old pole fence and about 100 feet North of North edge of clearing (the N.W. edge of reservoir).
