

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 140200

Quarter corner common to Sections 30 and 31, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M. $V=17^\circ$

Set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 31 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze cap stamped:

T34S R1W
S30
¼S —
S31
Jackson County 1974

In a mound of stone from the following evidence:

- A White Oak, 18-inch diameter, bears $S58^\circ W$, 49.2 feet to center of tree (original 1854 Ives and Hyde BT with scribing intact).
- The other original BT bears $N77^\circ E$, 97.9 feet to estimated face. This tree has been chopped in two and all scribing destroyed or rotted, now 22-inch diameter and dead.

I scribe new trees C.S. BT:

- A Yellow Pine, 7-inch diameter, bears $N13^\circ E$, 81.4 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- A double-trunk White Oak, 8-inch diameter, bears $S89^\circ E$, 53.89 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- Fence bears West 26.5 feet.
