

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200140

Quarter corner common to Sections 31 and 32, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found, the single remaining bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, a black oak, now 30-inch diameter with axed and/or rotted out faces.

From the preceding evidence, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe flush with the surface of the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

31 | 32

From which,

- The above-described original bearing tree, bears Record: S44°W, 38.28 feet to estimated face.

I mark new trees CS BT and take measurements to center of trees at blaze:

- White oak, 10-inch diameter, bears N68°E, 86.40 feet.
- Black oak, 10-inch diameter, bears S25°W, 23.95 feet.

Corner lies at southerly edge of dirt road, N80°E, 3.5 feet from 4-inch diameter iron gate post.

Note: For basis of bearing, see Jackson County Job File No. 78-6.
