

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240100

Quarter corner common to Section 32, Township 34 South, Range 1 West and Section 5, Township 35 South, Range 1 West.

For corner, Set a 1"x 36" galvanized iron pipe 30" in the ground, along the Westerly side of a large Pine anchor post, with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T34 & 35S, R1W

cor — c.s.

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now an 18" Black Oak with part of the BT scribe visible) bears South 8° East, 24.4 feet.

From said pipe corner, I establish the following new witness trees:

- A 10" Yellow Pine scribed "CS-BT" bears North 44° West, 13.2 feet;
- An 8" Yellow Pine scribed "CS-BT" bears South 29° East, 50.3 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240100

Quarter corner common to Section 5, Township 35 South, Range 1 West and Section 32, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found projecting 6 ins., the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe, with 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

T34S & 35S R1W

¼S — c.s.
COR 5
1964

As recorded on First Re-establishment, page 15, in 1964.

An original bearing tree, a Black Oak, now 25 ins. diam., with rotted and partially re-healed blazes, brs. S8°E, 24.8 feet to center of tree at lower blaze. Record: 24.42 feet.

Bearing trees marked on first re-establishment found:

- Ponderosa Pine, 13 ins. diam., with healed blazes, brs. Record: S29°E, 50.3 feet to estimated face. Re-measured; 50.5 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- Ponderosa Pine, 15 ins. diam. with healed blazes, brs. Record: N44°W, 13.2 feet to estimated face. Re-measured; 13.45 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Add mks. "1986" to found brass cap and mark a new tree "CS" "BT":

- Black Oak, 12 ins. diam. brs. N64½°W, 31.10 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies about 120 feet West of the top of southwesterly slope, at the West side of (wood) post corner of North-East and Southwest fence lines.
