

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

### LINE TREE

GCDB 327500

Original "Line Tree" recorded by Ives & Hyde in 1854, to be 12.82 chains (846.12 feet) West of the Quarter corner common to Sections 9 and 16, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found shell of White Oak snag, 31-inch diameter. The inside of this (hollow) tree, is now about 26-inch diameter and clearly shows axe ("hack") faces. Two on the east and two on the west side. The center base of this snag lies directly under an east-west line projected through the axe marks.

Reference the center base of this "line tree" as follows:

- White Oak, 6-inch diameter, scribed "CS" "BT", bears N30°E, 3.25 feet to center of tree at upper blaze.
- The most northerly branch, 6-inch diameter of a triple branch white oak, scribed "CS" "BT" bears S30°W, 15.15 feet to center of branch at lower blaze.

Subject line tree stands on brushed line, about 854 feet westerly of the quarter corner of Sections 9 and 16.
