

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 440300

One-Quarter corner common to Sections 22 and 27, Twp. 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

From the following original evidence at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe, 30 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Original bearing trees recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- Hollow White Oak, 14-inch diameter with Southeast side of tree axed out, bears Record: N33°W, 22.44 feet to estimated lower face.
- The burned remains of an Oak stump, bears Record: S30°E, 77.88 feet on slope.
- A recorded line tree, a White Oak, now 14 inches diameter, with two axe hacks on East and West sides of tree, bears S89°56'E (Basis of bearing) 427.16 feet to center of tree. Record: S89°56'E, 424.38 feet.

I mark new trees CS BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine, 12-inch diameter, bears S26°E 22.53 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 9-inch diameter, bears N62°50'W 62.15 feet.
- A found ¾-inch diameter iron pipe, projecting 4 inches, origin unknown, bears S76°17'W, 60.07 feet.

Corner lies approximately 83 feet N82½°E of 6-inch diameter White Oak, the corner of Northeast and West bearing fence lines and about 400 feet South of road near draw crossing.
