

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500440

One-Quarter corner common to Sections 14, and 15, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.
 $V = 19 \frac{1}{2}^\circ$

From the following original evidence, at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 30 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

JACKSON COUNTY 1979
T34S R1W

¼S

Original bearing trees recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- Black Oak, 14-inch diameter, with healed blazes, bears record $S37 \frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 26.40 feet on slope, to estimated face. Re-measured 25.27 feet to center of tree at base.
- Black Oak, 17-inch diameter, containing scribe marks in rotted upper face, bears Record: $N40^\circ W$ 1.98 feet to scribed face.

I mound stones around corner and Mark new trees CS BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze.

- Black Oak, 10-inch diameter bears $20^\circ E$, 40.60 feet
- Douglas Fir, 8-inch diameter, bears $S76^\circ W$, 17.30 feet.
