

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 540500

Quarter corner common to Section 11 and 14, Twp. 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.  $V = 18\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

From the following evidence, at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 28 ins. in the ground with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. bronze disc marked:

Original BTs recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, found as follows:

- Douglas Fir, 40-inch diameter, with healed blazes, bears record  $S83^\circ E$ , 25.08 feet to estimated face of lower blaze.
- Yellow Pine, 39-inch diameter, scribed " $\frac{1}{4}S$ " in exposed upper face, bears record  $N48^\circ W$ , 27.06 feet (on slope) to scribed face. Re-measured 24.8 feet to scribed face.

I marked new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Yellow Pine, 15-inch diameter, bears  $N67^\circ E$ , 16.6 feet.
- Douglas Fir, 16-inch diameter, bears  $S34\frac{1}{2}^\circ W$ , 52.0 feet.
