

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 540600

Quarter corner common to Section 2 and 11, Twp. 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M. $V = 20^\circ$

Found the original S.E. BT marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854, a White Oak, now a stob 15-inch diameter, and 4 feet high, with reverse impression of partial scribed "S $\frac{1}{4}$ " in hollow, decayed interior.

At record bearing and distance (S60°E, 50.16 feet.) to said White Oak, I set a 1x36-inch G.I. pipe 26 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Found a dead and down Black Oak, the root hole of which is at the record location of the N.W. BT.

I mark new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine, 4-inch diameter, bears N56°W, 28.6 feet.
- White Oak, 7-inch diameter, bears S38½°W, 37.0 feet.
