

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600300

Section corner common to Sections 23, 24, 25, and 26, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.
 $V = 22\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

Found original N.E. BT, now a shell of the original Oak, supporting new growth, containing scribed "T", "S24" and section of tree alongside with negative scribed "S" and partial "W" visible.

From which evidence and at record bearing and distance (N32°E 34.98 feet).

I set a 1½-inch x 36-inch G.I. pipe, 26 ins. in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

From which:

- The remains of a probable original BT, now a White Oak stump with old axe work bears S1°W, 22.0 feet (Record S1°W, 20.46 feet.)
- A stump hole containing Oak sprouts agrees favorable with location of original N.W. BT. Record: N61½°W, 85.8 feet. Oak remains were found at record location of original S.E. BT (S56°E, 48.18 feet.)

I marked new trees, C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 5-inch diameter, bears N80°E, 84.9 feet.
- A White Oak, 6-inch diameter, bears S41½°E, 82.7 feet.
- A White Oak, 7-inch diameter, bears S62½°W, 40.1 feet.
- A Black Oak, 5-inch diameter, bears N26½°W, 147.0 feet.
