

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640400

Quarter corner common to Sections 13 and 24, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

From the following original evidence, at the location described below, set a 1x36-inch Galvanized iron pipe, 29 ins. in the ground with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

Original bearing trees, recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found:

- White Oak sawed stump, 13-inch diameter, containing scribed "¼S" and "BT" in opened faces, bears Record: N44°E, 16.50 feet to lower face.
- Black Oak, 29-inch diameter, bears Record: S65°W, 19.14 feet to upper rotted face.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Black Oak, 18-inch diameter, bears N75½°E, 13.45 feet.
- Douglas fir, 19-inch diameter, bears S40°W, 49.34 feet.

Corner lies 28 feet South of an East-West fence line.
