

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700340

Quarter corner common to Section 24, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, and Section 19, Township 34 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Found the single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, now a rotted and burned pine stob, about 12-inch diameter at base, containing old axe work.

From the preceding original evidence, set a 1x36-inch Galvanized iron pipe, 28 ins. in the ground, with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

From which, the above-described original bearing tree, bears Record: S18°E, 55.44 feet to estimated position of original (lower) face.

Mark new trees "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir, 13-inch diameter, bears S22°16'E, 17.52 feet.
- White Oak, 8-inch diameter, located 1.5 feet West of North-South fence line, bears S76°04'W, 26.57 feet.

Corner lies on Westerly slope and on (± 45 year old) East-West blazed line. See also Jackson County Project File 86-67.
