

**FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT  
MEANDER CORNER OF S16 & 21 – WITNESS CORNER  
GCDB 357400**

Witness corner to: Meander corner located on right bank of the Rogue River and recorded in 1854, to be on the section line, 1331.88 feet Easterly of the quarter corner common to Sections 16 and 21.

At the witness corner, found projecting 1 ins., the ¾-inch diameter rebar, set in bedrock and marked:

"W.C."

On survey No. 3456 in 1967, from which:

- An original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 and reported on Survey No. 3456, a White Oak, now 22-inch diameter, containing scribed "BT" in remains of axed face bears S58°13'W, 288.78 feet. (**Note:** measurements calculated as visibility is obscured by timber.)

To perpetuate this position, take new references,

- Brass cap 2½-inch diameter marked:

T34S R1W

Set in cement, in bedrock, bears N88°15'15"E, 20.47 feet. Said brass cap is 0.7 feet higher in elevation than witness corner.

- White Oak, 13-inch diameter scribed "CS" "BT", bears N25°22`W, 48.8 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- The original meander corner position, not monumented and now under water, bears as recorded on survey 3456, S88°15'15"W, 6.07 feet.

From the above noted meander corner position, heretofore described references are computed to bear:

- Brass cap "reference monument", N88°15'15'E, 26.54 feet.
- Original "BT", S57°36'W, 283.6 feet to scribed face. Original Record: S57½°W, 283.8 feet.
- "CS" "BT" (1984); N18°32'W, 46.7 feet to center of tree.
