

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200300

Section corner common to Sections 19, 20, 29 and 30, Township 34 South, Range 2 East, W.M.

Found, at the corner a mound of stone with a pointed stone, 24x10x5 ins., projecting out of top, origin of which is unknown. I replace with a 2½-inch diameter bronze disc marked:

JACKSON COUNTY 1980

From which I find original bearing trees marked by N. Ford in 1855:

- Dead, down and rotted Pine with old axe marks, the stump hole of which, about 20-inch diameter bears N58°11'E, 200.30 feet to center. Record: N57°E, 201.96 feet.
- The center of a Black Oak stump ring, about 12-inch diameter containing new Black Oak growth, bears S57°47'E, 162.56 feet. Record: S57°E, 160.38 feet.
- Burnt Pine remains containing old axe work, the stump hole of which bears S75°50'W, 117.13 feet to center. Record: S76°W, 115.50 feet.
- The center of Pine stump core, about 10-inch diameter with old axe marks bears N20°18'W, 524.39 feet. Record: N21°W, 523.38 feet.

I mark new trees "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 9-inch diameter bears N59°36'E, 199.21 feet.
- White Oak, 6-inch diameter bears S53°59'E, 161.53 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 20-inch diameter bears S77°46'W, 118.81 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 24-inch diameter bears N52°58'W, 233.05 feet.
- Basis of bearings: C. Hurst, RLS #483, survey in progress.
