

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 140300

Quarter corner common to Sections 19 and 30, Township 35 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

Found, the single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, a White Oak, now 39 ins. diam., scribed "BT" in opened lower face.

From the preceding original evidence, set a 1 x 36 ins. galvanized iron pipe, 35 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. diam. bronze cap marked:

From which:

- The above-described original bearing tree brs. record: S48°30'E, 291.72 feet to scribed face.
- Set 5/8 x 30 ins. rebar flush, with yellow plastic cap marked: "JACKSON C.S.", brs. S48°30'E, 287.28 feet.

Mk. a new tree "CS" "BT":

- Ponderosa Pine, 42 ins. diam., brs. N29°09'E, 125.15 feet, to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies N20°E, about 23 feet from the center of old concrete irrigation gate located near intersection of double (parallel) fence lines, c.N30°W, East and South and approximately 10 feet East of gateway in most easterly, North-South fence line.
