

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200300

Corner common to Sections 19, 20, 29 and 30 Township 35 South Range 2 West.

Found the 5" x 24" x ? sandstone with cross on top, as set for corner by County Surveyor, F. A. Grisez in June, 1908 (See individual road petition No. 66). No evidence of the original witness trees could be found.

From said stone corner, I mark new witness trees as follows:

- A 16" White Oak, scribed "CS-BT" bears South $80\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 80.4 feet;
- A 7" Black Oak, scribed "CS-BT" bears North $2\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 119.5 feet;
- A 13" White Oak, scribed "CS-BT" bears South $32\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 223.2 feet.

Note: This monument was located by surveyor, L.E. Ager, during his survey of SAMS VALLEY PARK SUBDIVISION.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200300

Section corner common to Sections 19, 20, 29 and 30, Township 35 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

Found 2 feet deep, under a section of 10 ins. diam. concrete pipe, leaning northwest, the sandstone, marked with cross, described on first re-establishment, page 22, dated 1962. Reset concrete pipe (vertical) and directly over said cross, set a 1 x 27 ins. galvanized iron pipe (projects 3 ins.) with a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

Bearing trees marked on first re-establishment, found with healed blazes and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Black Oak, 15 ins. diam., brs. N1°55'E, 120.00 feet Record: N2¼°E, 119.5 feet
- White Oak, 23 ins. diam., brs. S80°45'E, 81.23 feet Record: 80.4 feet
- White Oak, 18 ins. diam., brs. S32°15'E, 224.0 feet Record: 223.2 feet

Set new references; 5/8 x 24 ins. rebars, flush, with yellow plastic caps marked "Jackson C.S." brs:

- N54°52'E, 18.80 feet, located on East-West fence line.
- S27°30'E, 16.90 feet, located on Northerly-Southerly fence line.

Corner lies 12 feet East of the middle of gravel road, c. North-South and S52°W, 23.8 feet from pole No. B-11797.
