

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300640

Quarter corner common to Sections 4 and 5, Township 35 South, Range 2 West.

Found a 12" Black Oak with face opened and "¼ S" scribe visible.

For corner, set a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe driven 32" in the ground with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T35S R2W
¼ 5 | 4 c.s.
cor.
1965

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a 12" Black Oak plainly scribed) bears North 14° West, 120.1 feet.

From said pipe corner, I establish the following new witness trees:

- A 12" Black Oak scribed "CS-BT" bears North 51¼° West, 37.3 feet to the face of the lower blaze;
- A 6" White Oak scribed "CS-BT" bears North 72° East, 36.1 feet to the face of the upper blaze;

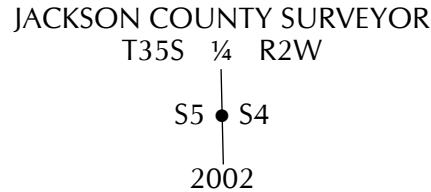

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300640

Quarter corner common to Sections 4 and 5, Township 35 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

Found at the corner position, bent over with the 2½ ins. diam. brass cap broken off, the 1x36 ins. galvanized iron pipe set on First Re-establishment in 1965. Set in exact position and 8 ins. below surface, a 1x36 ins. galvanized iron pipe with 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:



Bearing trees recorded on First Re-Establishment in 1965, found and measured to center of tree at lower blaze:

- Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, a dead and down oak with old chopping bears N14°W, 120.5 feet to center of stump hole. Record: 120.1 feet to face of lower blaze.
- A Black Oak, now 18 ins. diam. with healed blazes brs. N51¼°W, 38.0 feet. Record: 37.3 to face of lower blaze.
- A White Oak, now 8 ins. diam. with healed blazes brs. N72°E, 36.2 feet. Record: 36.1 feet to face of upper blaze.

Mark new bearing tree "CS" "BT" and take measurement to center of tree at lower blaze:

- A White Oak 9 ins. diam. brs. S26½°E, 39.15 feet.

Corner lies on easterly side of driveway, 8 ins. deep and 9.5 feet southerly of easterly gate post (4 ins. diam. pipe).
