

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200240

Quarter corner common to Sections 30 and 29, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM  $V = 20\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

Found a down and rotted Black Oak, containing partial scribed "S" and "4".

From the face of which, at record bearing and distance,  $N58^\circ W$ , 59.4 feet, I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe 24 ins. in the ground, with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. bronze disc marked:

No evidence of N.E. BT recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found.

I mound stones around corner, marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears  $N60^\circ E$ , 55.65 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 12 ins. diam., bears  $N16^\circ W$ , 67.2 feet.

Corner lies 25 feet East of North-South fence line.
