

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200440

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 18, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M. V =  $19\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$

Found White Oak, 18 ins. diam., containing scribe "T" in opened lower face. All other evidence of scribing had been destroyed by the occupants of tree, innumerable ants.

At record bearing and distance ( $S39^{\circ}W$ , 8.58 feet.) I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe 26 ins. in the ground with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. bronze disc marked:

    18 | 17  
Jackson County 1974

The Oak stump remains of the original S.E. BT, recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, bear record,  $S34^{\circ}E$ , 38.28 feet.

I mound stones around corner, marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears  $N34^{\circ}E$ , 36.0 feet.
- A Black Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears  $N48^{\circ}W$ , 50.2 feet.
