

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300240

Quarter corner common to Sections 28-29, Township 36 South, Range 1 East.

- Located corner from the witness tree in Section 28, a 10" black oak which bears N.51°E., 54 links.
- Also at the proper bearing and distance found the stump of the other witness tree, a 36" yellow pine.
- Blazed and marked a 14" white oak which bears N.19°W., 116.9 feet. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the upper blaze and BT on the lower.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300240

Quarter corner common to Sections 28 and 29, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM $V = 20^\circ$

Found bearing tree marked by A. T. Brown in 1914 on first re-establishment. At record bearing and distance, $N19^\circ W$, 116.9 feet from the center of said tree, a White Oak, now 16 ins. diam., containing scribed " $\frac{1}{4}$ " on opened upper face, I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe, flush with the ground, with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. bronze disc marked:

From which:

- A stump depression found at location of original N.E. BT ($N51^\circ E$, 35.64 feet.) as recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854.

I mound stone around corner, marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Ponderosa Pine, 26 ins. diam., bears $S70^\circ E$, 89.8 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 9 ins. diam., bears $N53^\circ W$, 92.7 feet.
