

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

Section corner common to Sections 20, 21, 28 and 29, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M.
V = 18°

Found unrecorded, 6 x 6 ins. concrete pedestal, projecting 5 ins. with a 3½ ins. brass cap marked:

From which:

Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- A Black Oak, 19 ins. diam., located on East-West fence line, bears S89°W, 100.4 feet to estimated face of blaze. Record, S89°W, 100.98 feet.
- A Black Oak, 15 ins. diam., with face chopped out, bears N81½°W, 140.9 feet to estimated face of blaze. Record, N81½°W, 140.58 feet.
- No evidence of original S.E. BT found

I marked the following trees C.S.BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A triple White Oak, 12 ins. diam., bears S62½°E, 60.5 feet.
- A White Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears S1°W, 80.9 feet.
- A double Black Oak, 12 ins. diam., bears N71°W, 52.5 feet.

Corner lies at intersection of North and East-West fence line.
