Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- The hollow West fork of a double Black Oak, containing reverse impression of scribed "T36S R1 16" in exposed upper face, bears N18°E, 52.74 feet to scribed face. Record, N18°E, 52.14 feet.
- A stump depression in evidence at record location of original S.E. BT, S68°E, 43.56 feet.
- A Black Oak, 27 ins. diam., containing reverse scribe marks (visible inside of tree) bears \$32½°W, 86.8 feet to scribed face. Record, \$32°W, 85.8 feet (**Note:** This tree, badly rotted, is located on an angle point of Northerly-Southerly fence line.

I mound stones around corner, marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:
