

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 340200

Quarter corner common to Sections 28, 33, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM $V=20^\circ$

From the following evidence and at the location described below I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe 12 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- A White Oak, 24 ins. diam., with healed blaze bears $S70^\circ W$, 38.94 feet to estimated face of blaze. Record, $S70^\circ W$, 38.94 feet.
- A Black Oak, 25 ins. diam., containing scribed "S" in partially opened face, bears $N45^\circ W$, 35.64 feet to scribed face.

I mound stones around corner, marked the following trees C.S.BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Black Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears $N11^\circ E$, 37.2 feet.
- A Black Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears $S87^\circ W$, 21.2 feet.

Corner lies 1 feet North of East-West fence line.
