

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500140

Quarter corner common to Sections 34 and 35, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM.  $V = 18\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

Found unrecorded 6x6 ins. concrete pedestal, projecting 6 ins. above ground with embedded 3½ ins. brass cap marked:

U.S. ENGINEER DEPARTMENT  
Portland District  
Boundary Monument

Original BTs recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- Oak stump remains bears record, N37°E, 14.5 feet.
- A White Oak, 30 ins. diam., located on East side of road, containing scribed " /S" in partially opened upper face, bears N81°W, 70.5 feet to scribed face. Record, N81°W, 71.94 feet.

I stamp the following information on found brass cap:

I marked new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears N35°E, 31.44 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 13 ins. diam., bears S72°W, 28.94 feet.

Corner lies 9 feet East of the center of a 9 feet wide stream bed, C. North.
