

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500600

Corner common to Sections 2, 3, 10 & 11, Township 36 South Range 1 East.

Set a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe 29" in the ground with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T.36S.R.1E.

Sec ——— Cor.
10 | 11
C.S.

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a 36" black oak scribed "BT") bears S79°E, 255.4 feet to the face of the lower blaze; (record = S79°E, 254.1 feet)
- The original bearing tree (now an 18" White Oak, with upper face chopped out and lower face left intact) bears S76°W, 196.0 feet to the face of the upper blaze. (Record = S76°W, 194.7 feet);
- A 16" yellow Pine, scribed "CS-BT" bears S88¾°E, 231.8 feet to the face of the lower blaze;
- A 22" yellow Pine, scribed "CS-BT" bears N14½°W, 281.9 feet to the face of the lower blaze;
- A 24" black Oak, scribed "CS-BT" bears S62¾°W, 340.1 feet to the face of the upper blaze.
