

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600100

Section corner on Township line, Sections 35 and 36, Township 36 South, Range 1 East and Sections 1 and 2, Township 37 South, Range 1 East.

Found an 18" White Oak snag to the Northeast and a 20" white oak stump flush with the ground and a pine stump badly burned.

For corner set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe 30" in the ground with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T36 & 37S, R1E

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a White Oak snag, plainly scribed) bears North $23\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East, 95.7 feet;
- The original bearing tree (now a White Oak stump) bears South $33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East, 118.1 feet;
- The original bearing tree (now a Pine stump) bears South $1\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 120.0 feet to the center. (Note: $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ local attraction).

There are no trees suited for witness trees since this corner falls in a burn. Raised a mound of stone around the pipe.

Section corner on Township line, Sections 35 and 36, Township 36 South, Range 1 East and Sections 1 and 2, Township 37 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Found the brass cap, projecting 3 ins., in ring of stone, marked:

T36S & 37S, R1E

As recorded on First re-establishment (page 9) in 1964.

The only evidence of references found, is a stump hole at (1964) record of "South $33\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ East, 118.1 feet".

To perpetuate this location, set new references; $\frac{5}{8}$ x 24 in. rebars, with Jackson County metal caps, 22 ins. in the ground:

- N17°E, 13.86 feet.
- S32°E, 17.91 feet.
- S49°W, 15.26 feet.

Mk. a new tree "CS BT":

- White Oak, 6 ins. diam., brs. N56°W, 44.10 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies 4 feet west of (wood post) corner of northerly-westerly and east bearing fence lines.
