

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600240

Quarter corner common to Sections 25 and 26, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M.  
V = 21°40'

Found both original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854. At the location described below, I set a 1x36 ins. G.I. pipe, in a mound of stone, 28 ins. in the ground from which:

- An original BT, a Black Oak, now 23 ins. diam., with healed blazes, bears S11°E, 63.36 feet to estimated face. Record, S14°E, 63.36 feet.
- An original BT, a White Oak, now 16 ins. diam., with healed blazes, bears record, S64°W, 72.6 feet to estimated face.

I marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Ponderosa Pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S57°E, 8.3 feet.
- A White Oak, 5 ins. diam., bears S31°W, 40.2 feet.

Corner lies about 11 feet West of North-South fence line.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600240

Quarter corner common to Sections 25 and 26, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Found projecting 2 ins. in a mound of stone, the 1 ins. diam. galvanized iron pipe, set on first re-establishment in 1974. In top of said pipe set a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

T36S R1E  
¼S  
26 | 25  
CS  
1989

Original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found:

- Black Oak 24 ins. diam., with healed blazes brs. record S11°E, 63.36 feet to estimated face. Re-measured to center of tree at lower blaze; 63.87 feet. Southwest BT is now down.

Bearing trees marked on first re-establishment found and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa pine, 14 ins. diam., with visible scribe marks on partially healed blazes, brs. S57°E, 8.10 feet. Record distance; 8.30 feet.
- White Oak 7 ins. diam., with healed blazes, brs. S31°W, 40.25 feet. Record distance 40.20 feet.

Corner lies on north slope, 11 feet west of north-south fence line and southwest of small reservoir about 800 feet.
