

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600540

Quarter corner common to Sections 11 and 12, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M. $V = 19^\circ$

From the following evidence and at the location described below, I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe 28 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- A Yellow Pine, 23 ins. diam., with healed blazes, bears record, N64°E, 37.62 feet to estimated face of blaze. Re-measured 38.0 feet to center of tree.
- A White Oak shell, about 24 ins. diam. and 8 feet high, containing scribed "BT", bears record, S75°W, 35.64 feet.

I mound stones around corner, marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 8 ins. diam., bears N15°E, 31.2 feet.
- A White Oak, 6 ins. diam., bears N25°W, 28.3 feet.
