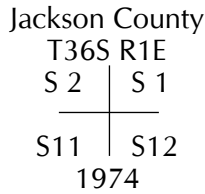


FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600600

Section corner common to Sections 1, 2, 11, and 12, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, WM
V = 21 3/4°

Found remains of a squared Pine post in a mound of stone. I replaced said post with a 1x36 ins. G.I. pipe, set 20 ins. in the ground with a 2 1/2 ins. bronze disc marked:



Original BTs marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found as follows:

- The stump remains of a down and rotted White Oak, bears N83°E, 25.0 feet. Record, N81°E, 25.08 feet.
- Rotted White Oak stump remains, bears record, S25°E, 31.02 feet.
- A Black Oak, 10 ins. diam., containing scribe marks in partially exposed upper face, bears record, S61°W, 62.04 feet (on slope) to scribed face.

I marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Black Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears N16°E, 31.8 feet.
- A White Oak, 5 ins. diam., bears S56°E, 21.8 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S42°W, 53.2 feet.
- A White Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears N1°W, 47.4 feet.
