

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640400

Quarter corner common to Sections 13 and 24, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, W.M. $V=21^\circ$.

Found original BT marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854, a Yellow Pine, now 26 ins. diam., containing scribe marks including scribed "B".

At record bearing and distance, $N63^\circ W$, 13.2 feet, I set a 1 x 36 ins. G.I. pipe 30 ins. in the ground with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. bronze disc marked:

The original S.E. BT has apparently been destroyed in construction of irrigation canal.

I mound stones around corner marked the following trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Black Oak, 10 ins. diam., bears $N43^\circ E$, 8.2 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 9 ins. diam., bears $S72^\circ E$, 15.2 feet.

Corner lies approximately 11 feet North of most Northerly shoulder of irrigation canal
