

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

### GCDB 700300

Corner to Sections 24 and 25, Township 36 South, Range 1 East, and Sections 19 and 30, Township 36 South, Range 2 East, W.M.

Found the original White Oak to the Southeast with scribe visible. Also the snag of the White Oak tree to the Northwest with old axe marks and the stump hole of the Pine to the Northeast. The distance between the Northwest and Southeast trees was 2.6 in excess of record. This excess was proportioned between these trees, which location also checks the course to the stump hole to the Northeast.

Set a 2" x 36" galvanized iron pipe 34" in the ground for corner.

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a 22" White Oak) bears  $S3\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}E$ , 316.7 feet.
- A 12" White Oak scribed CS-BT bears  $N52^{\circ}E$ , 17.3 feet.
- An 8" White Oak scribed CS-BT bears  $S67\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$ , 43.0 feet.
- An 11" White Oak scribed CS-BT (on single blaze) bears  $S67^{\circ}E$ , 64.8 feet.

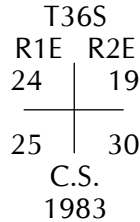

**SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT**

**GCDB 700300**

Section corner common to Sections 24 and 25, Township 36 South, Range 1 East and Sections 19 and 30, Township 36 South, Range 2 East, W.M.

At the corner, found flush on North-South fence line, the 2 ins. diam. galvanized iron pipe set on first re-establishment, in 1955. In top of said pipe in cement, set a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:



From which a White Oak stump shell is found at record location of original Southeast bearing tree.

Bearing trees marked in 1955 found and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 14 ins. diam., with healed blazes, brs. N52°E, 17.4 feet. Record; 17.3 feet.
- The Southerly branch, 17 ins. diam. of triple White Oak, brs. S67°E, 65.26 feet to center of said branch at healed single (low) blaze. Record; 64.8 feet.
- White Oak, 12 ins. diam., scribed "CS" in upper face found (sawed) open, brs. S67½°W, 43.60 feet. Record; 43.0 feet.
- The Northwest bearing tree is now gone.

Mk new tree "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze;

- White Oak, 16 ins. diam., brs. S44°W, 45.05 feet.
- Double White Oak, 24 ins. diam. at single blaze near base, brs. N3°W, 31.8 feet.

Corner lies about 135 feet South of road at gateway in North-South fence line.

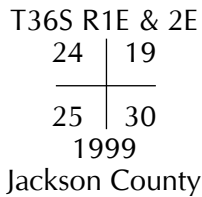
