

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 100100

Township corner to Townships 36 and 37 South, Ranges 4 and 5 West - being also the boundary between Jackson and Josephine Counties.

At the corner, found projecting 2 ins., a 1½ ins. diam. iron pipe, origin unknown. In the top of said pipe, in cement, set a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

The single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854,

- A Black Oak, now 41 ins. diam., hollow, with section of tree facing corner axed out, brs. Record: N25°W, 24.42 feet to estimated face. Re-measured; 25.0 feet to center of tree.
- Root hole containing Oak remains, brs. (original) Record: N23½°E, 50.82 feet.

Mk. new trees "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine, 14 ins. diam., brs. N9°22'E, 73.15 feet.
- White Oak, 6 ins. diam., brs. S87°07'W, 96.84 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 12 ins. diam., brs. N46°15'W, 117.75 feet.
- Set 5/8 x 30 ins. rebar, flush, 10 feet south of the (post) corner of Northerly-Southerly and East bearing fence line, with yellow plastic cap marked: "Jackson C.S." brs, S73°13'E, 40.10 feet.

Corner lies about 24 feet West of the middle of Savage Creek Road and 2 feet West of aluminum post.
