

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 140200

Quarter corner common to Sections 30 and 31, Township 36 South, Range 4 West.

Found original BT to Northeast intact; also stump of original BT to Southwest, from which set a 1"x36" galvanized pipe,

From which:

- The original BT a 14" Black Oak plainly scribed bears North 26° East, 39.6 feet;
- Scribe an 8" Black Oak CS-BT which bears South 19° 45' East, 49.9 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 140200

Quarter corner common to Section 30 and 31, Twp. 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M. $V = 19^\circ$

From the following evidence, at the location described below, I set a 1x36 ins. G.I. pipe 33 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

- An original BT, recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, now a sprouted Black Oak stump, 18 ins. diam., containing old axe work, bears record $N26^\circ E$, 39.6 feet to estimated lower face.
- A BT recorded by C. Z. Boyden on first re-establishment in 1933 (pg. 5), now a tipped over, rotted Black Oak snag, 14 ins. diam., containing reverse impression of axed face and partial scribed "B", the base of which bears record, $S19\frac{3}{4}^\circ E$, 49.9 feet.
- **Note:** Boyden's corner monument not found. See Survey No. 3310, dated 1966.
- A 1 ins. diam., iron pin, found bent over 5 ins. below the surface of the ground, bears northerly about 165 feet. See deed record, Volume 230, page 582, dated 1941. (N.E. corner tax lot 1400)
- A found 1¼x18 ins. G.I. pipe exposed 8 ins., in a mound of stone bears $N83\frac{3}{4}^\circ W$, 47.41 feet.

I mound stones around corner, marked new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Black Oak, 5 ins. diam., bears $S6^\circ W$, 54.8 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 8 ins. diam., bears $N51\frac{1}{2}^\circ W$, 79.9 feet.

Corner lies 10 feet North of North edge of road and 17 feet South of dry branch.
