

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300640

Quarter corner common to Sections 4 & 5, Township 36 South, Range 4 West.

Found the original witness tree to the Northwest and sprouts around the stool for the Southeast witness tree to agree with the Government Record.

Set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe with brass cap stamped:

T36S R4W  
¼ Cor. 5 | 4 C.S.  
1961

30" in the ground for corner,

From which:

- The original witness tree, now a 24" Black Oak, plainly scribed on the negative, bears North 83° West, 17.8 feet;
- Found a 1" iron pipe, firmly set, which bears South 1.05 feet.

I take new trees as follows:

- A 12" Sugar Pine, scribed "CS-BT" bears South 68° East, 18.4 feet.
- A 16" Fir, scribed "CS-BT" bears South 55½° West, 14.2 feet.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300640

Quarter corner common to Sections 4 and 5, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Found projecting 6 ins., the 1 ins. diam. galvanized iron pipe, with 2 ½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

T36S R4W  
¼ 5 | 4 C.S.  
Cor. 1961

Set on first re-establishment, page 17, dated 1961.

An original bearing tree, recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854,

- A black oak, 26 ins. diam., partly dead and lower portion of tree hollow, brs. Record: N83°W, 17.8 feet to estimated face.

Bearing trees marked in 1961 feet:

- Sugar Pine snag, 19 ins. diam., scribed "CS" "BT" in exposed faces, brs. Record: S68°E, 18.4 feet to scribed upper face.
- Douglas Fir, 18 ins. diam., with healed blazes, brs. Record: S55½°W, 14.2 feet to estimated lower face. Re-measured 14.87 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- A clenched bottom 1¼x24 ins. iron pipe is found lying alongside corner.

Mk a new tree "CS" "BT":

- Black Oak, 11 ins. diam., brs. N72°E, 31.60 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies on gentle, Easterly slope, about 60 feet N45°W of draw.
