

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300700

Section Corner on the Township line Sections 32, 33, 5 & 4 Township 35, South Range 4 West and Township 36 South Range 4 West.

Found a 1½" steel tube set for corner, the original NW BT with BT scribe legible, also stump of the original SW BT with BT scribe legible stump of SE BT no scribe visible and stump hole of NE BT.

Set a 2"x36" galvanized iron pipe 33" in the ground for corner at the exact location of the said steel tube from which:

- The original 8" White Oak bears N. 36°W. 66.4 feet,
- Scribe a 16" cedar CS-BT which bears S. 46¾°W. 55.8 feet
- Scribe a 6" White Oak CS-BT which bears N. 12½°W. 93.5 feet
- Scribe a 14" Y. Pine CS-BT which bears N. 48½°E. 45.3 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300700

Section corner common to Sections 4 and 5, Township 36 South, Range 4 West and Sections 32 and 33, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Found a 2½ ins. diam. aluminum Bureau of Land Management cap marked:

T35S R4W	
S32	S33

S5	S4
T36S

Protruding 4 ins. above ground with the 2 ins. diam. galvanized iron pipe, set on the first re-establishment page 15, in the ground alongside, protruding 3 ins. Also, found the 1½ ins. diam. by 19 ins. long metal tube, replaced on the first re-establishment, lying alongside the cap.

Original bearing trees marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found:

- White Oak, 10 ins. diam. with "BT" visible in exposed lower face, brs. Record: N36°W, 66.2 feet to estimated face. Re-measured 66.5 feet to center of tree at base.
- Pine stump shell, 40 ins. diam. with "BT" and chaining notch visible, brs. Record: S36¾°W, 58.7 feet to chain notch.

Bearing trees marked on the first re-establishment found:

- Incense Cedar, 22 ins. diam. with healed double blaze brs. Record: S46¾°W, 55.8 feet to estimated face. Re-measure 56.47 feet to center of tree at base.
- White Oak, 9 ins. diam. with healed double blaze, brs. Record: N12½°W, 93.5 feet to estimated face. Re-measured 93.8 feet to center of tree at base.
- Ponderosa Pine, 18 ins. diam. with healed double blaze, brs. Record: N48½°E, 45.3 feet to estimated face. Re-measure 45.8 feet to center of tree at base.

Bearing tree marked by BLM found:

- Double Black Oak, north branch, 4 ins. diam., scribed T36SR4W, S4BT on single blaze, brs. S28¼°E, 18.54 feet to center of tree at base.

Take a new reference:

- Bearing object a 6x6x? ins. stone protruding 3 ins. above the ground with "X" chiseled on top in ring of stone, brs. S25½°E, 10.46 feet.

Corner lies at intersection of north-south-east-west partly down fence lines and approximately 800 feet North of residence 280 Fielder Creek Road.
