

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 400700

North Section Corner on Township line, Sections 3 & 4, Township 36 South, Range 4 West.

Found original BT to Southwest plainly scribed, also original BT to Southeast (intact) together with the remains of the other two original BTs

From which evidence

- Set a 2"x36" galvanized iron pipe 30" in the ground for corner

From which:

- The original BT a 16" White Oak which bears South  $51\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  East, 68.0 feet.
- Scribe a 16" White Oak CS-BT which bears South  $27\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$  West, 56.2 feet;
- Scribe a 20" White Oak CS-BT which bears North  $87^{\circ}$  East, 36.1 feet;
- Scribe a 6" Yellow Pine CS-BT which bears North  $84\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West, 34.1 feet.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 400700

Section Corner common to Sections 33, 34 Township 35 South, Range 4 West and Sections 3, 4, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Found the 2" iron pipe exposed 4" set for the corner on the first re-establishment by Deputy County Surveyor C. Z. Boyden on April 18, 1938.

Set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe inside of said 2" iron pipe corner monument with a 2½" bronze cap exposed 12". Cap stamped:

T35-36S, R4W

From which:

- The original bearing tree, now a 15" White Oak with healed blazes, bears S 51°54'E, 69.2 feet to the center (Original Record: 12" White Oak bears S 51°E, 67.98 feet)
- The original bearing tree, now a 24" White Oak with open rotted faces, bears S 74°48'W, 26.1 feet to the face of the lower blaze. (Original Record: 18" White Oak bears S 75°W, 26.50 feet).
- The Northeast bearing tree established on said first re-establishment, now a 24" White Oak with healed blazes, bears N 86°53'E, 36.3 feet to the center. (Record: 20" White Oak bears N87°E, 36.1 feet)
- The Southwest bearing tree established on said first re-establishment, now a 16" White Oak with healed blazes, bears S 27° 42'W, 56.9 feet to the center (Record: 16" White Oak bears S 27¾° W, 56.2 feet).
- The Northwest bearing tree established on said first re-establishment, now a 12" Yellow Pine with healed blazes, bears N 84° 20'W, 33.7 feet to the center. (Record: 6" Yellow Pine, bears N84½°W, 34.1 feet).
