

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500540

One-Quarter corner common to Sections 10 and 11, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.
 $V = 20\frac{1}{4}^\circ$

Found, $\frac{3}{4}$ ins. diam. G.I. pipe exposed 1 ins. as recorded on Survey No. 4569 of Jackson County Surveyor's records.

I replace the above with a 1x36 ins. G.I. pipe projecting 6 ins. with $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam. bronze disc marked:

From which reference trees recorded on above survey brs. to unscribed upper face, as follows:

Distance measurements taken to center of tree at lower blaze.

- Laurel, 6 ins. diam. with "BT" scribe visible in lower face, brs. $S79\frac{3}{4}^\circ E$, 7.0 feet. Record: $S79^\circ 40'E$, 6.5 feet.
- Laurel, 5 ins. diam. with "BT" scribe visible in lower face, brs. $N75^\circ W$, 8.7 feet. Record: $N75^\circ 02'W$, 8.5 feet.

Found, the original Black Oak reference tree recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, now 14 ins. diam. dead and down with reverse "BT" scribe and chain notch visible. Stump hole is at approximate record location.

Stump hole is all that remains of the Southeast reference tree.

I mark new reference tree "CS" "BT" and take measurements to center of tree at lower blaze:

- Laurel, 11 ins. diam. brs. $N37\frac{3}{4}^\circ E$, 16.4 feet.
- I deposit found $\frac{3}{4}$ ins. diam. pipe alongside.

Corner lies approximately 70 feet West of draw course Southerly on Southeast slope of hill.
