

**FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT**

**GCDB 540300**

Quarter corner common to Sections 23 and 26, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Set 3x3x20" stake for corner.

Found stump of laurel BT to Southwest; also black oak to Northeast badly damaged by fire.  
No scribe mark legible; chain East to top of ridge and check original note allowing for overchain.

Scribe a 18" black oak forked, C.S.-BT, bears  $S2^{\circ}15'E$ , 164.0 feet.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 540300

Quarter corner common to Sections 23 and 26, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

At the corner, found projecting 4 ins., in ring of stone, the  $\frac{5}{8}$  ins. diam. smooth iron pin set on Survey No. 3599 in 1967. Affixed to the top of said pin is found an unrecorded  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam. brass cap marked:

T36S R4W

I remove said brass cap, deposit it alongside corner and place over found pin a 1 x 36 ins. galvanized iron pipe set 24 ins. in the ground with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam. brass cap marked:

T36S,R4W

The single remaining bearing tree, marked on above noted 1967 survey,

- A Ponderosa Pine, 20 ins. diam., with healed single blaze, now dead and burnt by recent (1981) forest fire, brs. S28°E, 201.5 feet to center. Record: 200.9 feet.

As there are no living trees available, set  $\frac{5}{8}$  x 30 ins. rebars, 18 ins. in the ground with yellow plastic caps marked "Jackson C.S.":

- N35 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E, 10.95 feet.
- S34 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E, 10.41 feet.

Corner lies about 450 feet West of location marker on 2 ins. diam. Oak, located at top of and approximately 330 feet South of saddle in North-South bearing ridge. Bearing references, observed from the corner to facilitate finding same, follow:

- The high point of a 30 feet high, vertical face, rock out-crop brs. S37°E, an estimated 350 ft.
- The top of knoll brs. N42°W, an estimated 2,700 feet distant
- Large high-way direction sign located on the South side of I-5, brs. S39 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W, an estimated 4,500 feet distant.
