

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640500

Quarter corner common to Sections 12 and 13, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Found 6 ins. deep, the 2 ins. diam. iron pipe reported set on Survey No. 2802. In the top of said pipe, set in concrete, a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

Original bearing tree marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found:

- Black Oak stump, with partial scribe marks on a piece of face found alongside brs. Record: S52°W, 44.9 feet (slope chained), 43.28 feet level to estimated face.

Bearing trees marked on Survey No. 2802 found:

- Black Oak, now 12 ins. diam. with double healed blazes, brs. N34½°E, 32.97 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- Yellow Pine, now 22 ins. diam. with exposed upper face containing scribe marks including "S" and "3" visible, brs. S4°E, 46.75 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies in a small opening, on a 45% West slope, an estimated 300 feet South of the North end of a North-South dirt road.
