

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640700

Quarter Section corner on the Township line, Section 36, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, and Section 1, Township 36 South, Range 4 West.

Found the northwest BT a White Oak snag with $\frac{1}{4}$ S legible. Also stump of Laurel which corresponds with the southwest BT.

From which evidence

- Set a 1"x25" galvanized iron pipe 20" in the ground for corner

From which

- A 16" fir scribed CS-BT bears S. 37° W. 7.3 feet;

Scribe a 6" Black Oak CS-BT which bears N. 71° W. 21.2 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 640700

Quarter corner common to Section 36, Township 35 South, Range 4 West and Section 1, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Found projecting 2 ins., the 1 ins. diam. galvanized iron pipe reported set on first re-establishment, page 14, in 1952. In the top of said pipe, set in concrete, a 2½ ins. diam. brass cap marked:

Original bearing tree marked by Ives and Hyde in 1854 found:

- Oak snag 12 ins. diam. with partial scribed "4" visible in rotted upper face, brs. N68½°W, 20.46 feet to estimated lower face. Record: N69°W, 20.46 feet.

Bearing trees marked on first re-establishment found and double healed blazes and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir, now 23 ins. diam., brs. S38¼°W, 7.7 feet. Record: S37°W, 7.3 feet.
- Black Oak, now 10 ins. diam., brs. Record: N71°W, 21.45 feet. Record distance; 21.2 feet.

Bearing trees marked on Survey No. 735 in 1955 found with single healed blazes and measured to center of trees at root crown:

- Ponderosa Pine, 16 ins. diam., brs. N41¾°E, 19.7 feet. Record: N41°55'E, 20.0 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 20 ins. diam., brs. Record: S33¼°E.
- A location poster placed on a 14 ins. diam. Black Oak on the West edge of a gravel road, course North-South, brs. approximately East, an estimated 1000 feet.

Corner lies in timber, on a 40% South slope.
