

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700300

Section corner common to Section 24 and 25, Twp. 36 South, Range 4 West and Section 19 and 30, Twp. 36 South, Range 3 West, W.M.  $V = 20\frac{1}{4}^\circ$

Found, the only remaining original BT recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, now a Black Oak snag, 30 in. diam., at base, containing scribe marks including "T36S" in exposed upper face.

From the preceding evidence, I set a 1x36 ins. G.I pipe 24 ins. in the ground with a 2½ ins. bronze disc marked:

From which the above-described original BT bears record  $S2^\circ E$ , 30.36 feet to estimated lower face.

- Rocky ravine, C.  $N65^\circ W$ , bears South, 93 feet. Record, 363 feet.

I marked new trees C.S. BT and take measurements to center of tree at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 4 ins. diam., bears  $N70\frac{1}{4}^\circ E$ , 30.76 feet.
- White Oak, 7 ins. diam., bears  $S24^\circ E$ , 61.60 feet.
- White Oak, 4 ins. diam., bears  $S54\frac{1}{4}^\circ W$ , 17.61 feet.
- White Oak, 4 ins. diam., bears  $N9^\circ W$ , 19.34 feet.
