

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240340

Center quarter corner to Section 20, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found 14 inches deep the stone marked with chiseled cross, set by Charles A. Nutter, in 1929. Reference, Ancient Survey Book A-2, page 4-8.

To perpetuate this location, directly over said chiseled cross, set 1x10-inch Galvanized iron pipe 3 inches below the surface of the ground, in concrete, with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

Mound stones around corner and take the following references:

- Black Oak, 17-inch diameter bears S10°57'E to center of tree, 40.24 feet to nail in shiner, in East side of tree near base.
- White Oak, 13-inch diameter, bears S59°09'W to center of tree, 19.40 feet to nail in shiner, found on North side of tree near base. This tree is found with healed single blaze indicating a probable (unrecorded) reference tree.
- Both reference trees stand at southerly edge of (dirt) driveway.
- A found ½-inch diameter iron pin, 3349.75 feet distant bears N44°26'23"E (reference V. Thomas (ORLS 505) survey in progress.

Corner lies about 22 feet, S50°E of location marker on 10-inch diameter Madrone alongside Big Buck Road.
