

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 300300

Section corner common to Sections 20, 21, 28 and 29, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found the single remaining original bearing tree, a Yellow Pine, now 19-inch diameter with scribe marks including "R1W S28" visible, in opened upper face, as recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854.

From the preceding original evidence, recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, set a 2 x 36 inches iron pipe (found lying near the corner position), 28 inches in the ground.

In the top of said pipe, set a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

From which: the above-described original bearing tree bears Record: S28°E, 54.78 feet to said upper face.

Bearing trees recorded on Survey No. 2116 found and Re-measured to center of tree at root crown:

- Douglas Fir, now 17-inch diameter with single healed blaze, bears N37°E, 38.20 feet.  
Record: N40°E, 37.62 feet.
- Yellow Pine, now 11-inch diameter with single healed blaze, bears S76¾°E, 13.40 feet.  
Record: S72°E, 13.86 feet.
- Yellow Pine, now 18-inch diameter with partially healed single blaze, bears S11°W, 8.85 feet.  
Record: S6°W, 9.24 feet.
- Yellow Pine, now 16-inch diameter with single healed blaze, bears N33°W, 16.44 feet.  
Record: N31°W, 15.18 feet.

Corner lies in moderate timber on top of a ridge, course N30°E.
