

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500700

Section corner common to Sections 34 and 35, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, and Sections 2 and 3, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found, the single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Ives & Hyde in 1854, now a hollow White Oak stob, 15-inch diameter containing reverse impression of scribe marks in both (reverse) faces.

From the preceding original evidence, set a 1-inch diameter, 36 inches long, galvanized iron pipe, flush with the surface of the ground, with a 2½-inch diameter bronze cap marked:

"JACKSON COUNTY 1981"

From which,

- The above-described original bearing tree bears record, S28°W, 129.36 feet to (reverse) lower face.

Set new references, rebars, 5/8-inch diameter, 30 inches long flush, with yellow plastic caps marked: "Jackson C.S." on North-South fence line bears:

- N51°47'E, 42.35 feet.
- S56°00'E, 39.51 feet.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 11-inch diameter bears S68°55'W, 58.10 feet.
- White Oak, 19-inch diameter bears N13°45'W, 46.52 feet.

Corner lies about 260 feet South of creek c. Westerly.
