

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700100

Township corner common to Township 38 South, Ranges 1 West and 1 East, and Township 39 South, Ranges 1 West and 1 East, W.M.

Found the $\frac{3}{4}$ " iron pipe as reported found for the corner by Surveyor L. E. Ager on Recorded Survey NO. 3698. Resident McKenzie McCulloch was shown this pipe for the corner location in 1942.

Replaced said pipe with a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe, 36" in the ground with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T38-39S R1E-1W

From which:

- Found the original bearing tree (now a 14" burned and dead Oak snag, plainly scribed) which bears N23°W, 54.2 feet to the face of the upper blaze (Record: N26°W, 55.4 feet.)
- Found no evidence of the other original bearing trees, and there are no available trees for reference.

The corner falls 1 foot West of a "North-South" fence line.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700100

Section corner common to Section 36, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, Section 31, Township 38 South, Range 1 East, Section 1, Township 39 South, Range 1 West and Section 6, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Found flush in concrete, the 2½-inch diameter brass cap set on First re-establishment in 1970. Said brass cap is marked:

T38-39S R1E-1W

As recorded in 1970.

The single remaining original bearing tree, recorded by Ives & Hyde in 1854 and reported in 1970,

- Now a hollow oak snag, 12-inch diameter, containing reverse impression of scribed "BT" and axed chain notch, bears N23°W, 54.08 feet to said chain notch. Record (1854): N26°W, 55.44 feet.

Mark a new tree "CS" "BT":

- White Oak, 4-inch diameter, bears N63°E, 27.5 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies on Northeast slope, about 1 foot West of partially down (North-South) fence line and near top of cut bank of old road bed C. North-South.
